THE CIRCLE OF SECURITY: INTEGRATING ATTACHMENT THEORY WITH RELATIONSHIP-BASED INTERVENTIONS



BOB MARVIN, PHD was an undergraduate student and research associate with Mary D. Ainsworth at The Johns Hopkins University. He received his Ph.D. in developmental and clinical psychology from the University of Chicago in 1972.

After completing a postdoctoral fellowship at the Institute of Child Development, University of Minnesota he began teaching at the University of Virginia, where he is currently Professor Emeritus in the School of Medicine and Research Professor in the Department of Psychology. He is also Director of the Mary D. Ainsworth Child-Parent Attachment Clinic in Charlottesville, Virginia.

Throughout his career, Dr. Marvin has been active in basic and clinical attachment research and with families who have children with chronic medical conditions and/or histories of disrupted early relationships. This work has led him to focus increasingly on clinical issues, including assessment and intervention with families experiencing divorce, and with foster and adopted children.

With Glen Cooper, Kent Hoffman, and Bert Powell, Dr. Marvin has been active in developing and testing the *Circle of Security* intervention protocol. Currently, he is especially active in using the Circle of Security framework in developing community-based partnerships among professionals working with families whose children are at risk of removal, foster and adoptive families, children of divorce, families who have children with chronic medical conditions, and parent-child relationship challenges in other at-risk populations. He travels extensively to train these professionals in implementing science-based practices that integrate developmental psychology, clinical psychology, and family systems work.

E. MARIO MARQUEZ, PHD, ABMP is a prescribing psychologist specializing in child and adolescent clinical/school psychology, and psychopharmacology. He is the first civilian psychologist in the U.S. to be granted board certification to prescribe psychotropic medications as a Conditional Prescribing Psychologist.

Dr. Marquez earned his Ph.D. in counseling psychology from the University of New Mexico in 1990, and his post-doctoral certificate in psychopharmacology from the Southwestern Institute for the Advancement of Psychotherapy/New Mexico State University Collaborative in 2003.

Dr. Marquez is a Past President of the American Psychological Association's (APA) American Society for the Advancement of Pharmacotherapy (Division 55). He is a recipient of the APA Karl F. Heiser Award, the Division 55 Award for Outstanding State Contribution, an APA Fellow, and a Board Certified Diplomate in Medical Psychology.
